- 5. Suffice it to say that the parties have amicably settled the dispute and signed and verified the consent terms. The counsel appearing for the parties have identified the respective clients. In the light of discussion herein above, no fruitful purpose will be served by continuing the proceedings of the Appeal No. AT07/00544/2025.
- 6. In that view of the matter, we pass the following order;

ORDER

- 1. The Appeal No. AT07/00544 is allowed in terms of consent terms entered between the parties to the appeal.
- 2. The parties in the Appeal shall strictly abide by the consent terms.
- 3. Accordingly, the appeal stands disposed of.
